5 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: I welcome
6 everybody for the State Armory Board meeting
7 for June 23rd. We have a quorum here at the
8 state headquarters, and I would entertain a
9 motion to call the meeting to order.

10 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: I move to call
11 the meeting to order. This is Theresa
12 Martinez, Executive Director for the State
13 Armory Board.

14 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: I
15 second it. Jim Keefner.

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you.

17 Thank you, sir.

18 At this time I would like to do
19 the introduction of guests. What I would
20 like to do is go through the room, and then
21 we'll go on the line, so that Mr. Lee can
22 make sure that he's captured everybody that's
23 in the meeting.

24 Mr. Lee, here in the room we have?

25 CAPTAIN DANIEL RUIZ: Captain Daniel

1 Ruiz, Programming, G-9.

2 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: Mr. Lorren Deakin,
3 Facilities Management Officer.

4 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Colonel Nathan
5 Carper, Chief of Staff.

6 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Theresa V.
7 Martinez, Executive Director.

8 MR. LARRY MONTAÑO: Larry Montaña,
9 CFO.

10 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Marty Burney, State
11 Armory Board Administrator.

12 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: On the line,
13 if we can start with the Armory Board
14 members.

15 I see Mr. Keefner.

16 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Jim
17 Keefner.

18 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Sergeant
19 Major John Torres here.

20 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you.

21 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: David
22 Chacon is here.

23 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Welcome.

24 I would like to take a moment here
25 to welcome Colonel (Retired) David Chacon as

1 a new Armory Board member. We welcome your
2 leadership and experience here in the New
3 Mexico National Guard, and look forward to
4 working with you in this role. Thank you for
5 being with us and volunteering your time.

6 From the units I do see Major
7 Hischar and Lieutenant Colonel Olichwier, as
8 previously identified, and Major Glossop. I
9 appreciate you gentleman calling in as well.

10 Presenters, I see a lady in the
11 upper right-hand corner. If you would,
12 please.

13 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Is that me? This
14 is Hannah Hausman, Executive Director of
15 Santa Fe Children's Museum.

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Good morning,
17 Hannah. Thank you. I couldn't see the name.

18 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: That's okay.
19 It's good to see you.

20 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Good to see
21 you, ma'am. Thank you.

22 Anybody else on the line we may
23 have missed?

24 STAFF SERGEANT LOPEZ: Staff Sergeant
25 Timothy Lopez representing the Alamogordo

1 Armory.

2 MS. DELILAH TENORIO: Delilah Tenorio,
3 with the Attorney General's Office. I'm here
4 acting as Board Counsel for today.

5 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Good morning,
6 ma'am. Thank you for joining us, and your
7 representation.

8 On behalf of the Adjutant General,
9 he was pulled away this morning, and he is our
10 Chairman. He is attending to matters in a
11 state active duty capacity up in Las Vegas
12 and Mora, and taking care of our citizens up
13 in those parts of the state that are under a
14 potential flooding threat following the fires.
15 We will be conducting the meeting without our
16 Chairman, but we do have a quorum, as stated,
17 so we'll move forward with the agenda.

18 At this point I would ask that
19 Sergeant Major Torres, if you would lead us
20 in our invocation, please.

21 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Okay.

22 Loving heavenly father, we are
23 gathered here today to ask you for your
24 blessing and guidance, and to help us and
25 protect us.

1 We pray for our leadership,
2 Brigadier General Aguilar, and for our
3 soldiers who are in support of state missions,
4 and in support of COVID.

5 We also pray for our families,
6 especially those that are on active duty and
7 during COVID.

8 We also pray for Major (Retired)
9 Mark Gonzales, the former member of the State
10 Armory Board. Rest in piece.

11 This we ask in the name of our
12 Lord, Jesus Christ, and to protect us and
13 lead us during this time of change in our
14 country, and we ask this in his Holy Name,
15 amen.

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you,
17 Sergeant Major Torres.

18 Since Sergeant Major Cantrell is
19 at the graduation for National Guard USASMA,
20 I would ask Mr. Burney, you're also proud to
21 lead us in the pledge of allegiance.

22 MR. BURNEY: I pledge allegiance to
23 the flag of the United States of America, and
24 to the republic for which it stands, one
25 nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty

1 and justice for all.

2 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you.

3 All right. Moving to the next
4 item on the agenda, I would like to consider
5 a motion to approve the agenda as published.

6 I am ahead of myself there.

7 Roll call of the State Armory
8 Board.

9 Mr. Burney, please.

10 MR. MARTY BURNEY: General Aguilar is
11 excused.

12 Theresa Martinez.

13 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Present.

14 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Nathan
15 Carper.

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Present.

17 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major
18 Cantrell is excused.

19 Colonel (Retired) James Keefner.

20 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER:
21 Present.

22 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel (Retired)
23 David Chacon.

24 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON:
25 Present.

1 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major John
2 Torres.

3 SERGEANT MAJOR (RETIRED) TORRES:
4 Present.

5 MR. MARTY BURNEY: We have a quorum,
6 sir.

7 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you,
8 Mr. Burney.

9 Now at this time I would entertain
10 a motion to approve the agenda as published.

11 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: So moved. I
12 move to approve the agenda as written.

13 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Sergeant
14 Major Torres; I second.

15 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Mr. Burney,
16 would you lead us in a voice confirmation for
17 Mr. Lee.

18 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Yes, sir.

19 Theresa Martinez.

20 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Aye.

21 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Carper.

22 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Aye.

23 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Keefner.

24 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Aye.

25 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Chacon.

1 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: Aye.

2 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major
3 Torres.

4 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Aye.

5 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you.
6 The ayes have it.

7 The next item on the agenda is the
8 approval of the March 17th minutes as
9 distributed by Mr. Bernie. I would entertain
10 a motion to approve the minutes that were
11 published.

12 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: I so move; I
13 was waiting for someone else.

14 This is Theresa Martinez; I move
15 to approve the minutes as written.

16 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Jim
17 Keefner seconds.

18 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you.

19 Mr. Burney, if you will call the
20 roll.

21 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Theresa Martinez.

22 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Aye.

23 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Nathan
24 Carper.

25 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Aye.

1 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Keefner.

2 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Aye.

3 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Chacon.

4 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: Aye

5 RFR.

6 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major

7 Torres.

8 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Aye.

9 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Very good. So
10 moved. All right. Thank you all for that.

11 Now we'll begin our new business.

12 At this point I believe we have a
13 presentation from the Santa Fe Children's
14 Museum, Ms. Hausman. I don't know if we have
15 slides to pull up, but if we do, just give us
16 a second to accomplish that, and we'll turn
17 it over to you, ma'am.

18 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Thank you. Yes,
19 Marty should have some slides.

20 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: We are willing
21 the computer to move forward.

22 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Just let me know
23 when you're ready.

24 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Yes, ma'am.
25 One second.

1 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Would you like me
2 to move forward? I can always do that without
3 the slides.

4 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: One more
5 second; I think we're almost there. If not,
6 we will move forward.

7 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Okay.

8 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: We do have the
9 slide deck.

10 MS. TABITHA GONZALES: Can you e-mail
11 it to -- he can put it on his desktop.

12 You didn't send it to us; right?

13 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Uh-huh.

14 MS. TABITHA GONZALES: Oh, you did
15 send it to us?

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: It seems that
17 technology has got the better of us right now.

18 It was an attachment to the agenda
19 when it was sent, if you have access to that.

20 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: I do.

21 That's okay. I took a lot of
22 improv when I was younger, so I can do it.
23 No worries.

24 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: That's
25 awesome.

1 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Well, good
2 morning, everybody. Thank you for having me.
3 I'm the Executive Director of the Santa Fe
4 Children's Museum.

5 Hard to believe we're celebrating
6 our 37th year. We were very happy to be able
7 to reopen the facility in August of 2021, and
8 since then have served thousands and thousands
9 of families, including our active duty and
10 non-active duty military, which we provide
11 special discounts to, and others.

12 We provide a lot of outreach in
13 the community, and that's why these capital
14 improvements are so important for our
15 facility. As you know, it is a 1930s
16 facility, and so keeping it as up-to-date and
17 in good shape as possible is important to all
18 of us.

19 We are requesting -- we have a bit
20 of balance that we have in DCA, as the
21 Department of Cultural Affairs is aware, that
22 we'd like to spend leftover from our FY19
23 Capital Outlay Award, and the projects that I
24 would like to move forward on for the building
25 are:

1 LED lighting: Energy efficient
2 upgrades in specific areas of the museum,
3 which would you be our administration, and
4 specifically classrooms that serve our camp
5 children and our public programs. That would
6 make us more energy efficient, as you know.

7 Replacement and installation of
8 enhanced touchless bottle-filling stations
9 for our water fountains: Inside the museum,
10 we don't have those, and we feel it would be
11 more COVID safe to have those types of bottle
12 filling stations in the museum.

13 Lighting and electrical upgrades
14 in our museum gift shop: It's currently in
15 need of that. It's a very dark space, so we
16 would like to have those available as well.

17 And then replacement of very aging
18 and disrepaired VCT flooring in our Museum
19 Administration. That's located on the first
20 and second floors of the building.

21 Those are the proposed improvements
22 that we would like to make. I am appreciative
23 of the time you gave me this morning, and
24 please let me know if you have any questions.

25 We are very grateful for you as

1 our landlord and as our partner, and please
2 let me know what I can do to answer any
3 questions this morning.

4 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you,
5 ma'am. These all sound like great projects
6 to use from the FY19 capital outlay.

7 I would open up discussion from
8 the Board members to see if there is any
9 questions that they would have for you before
10 we take a vote.

11 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: No
12 questions from Keefner.

13 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: No
14 questions from Dave Chacon.

15 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Anybody else
16 in the group?

17 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: No.

18 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Okay. I would
19 entertain a motion that we consider and
20 approve the requested execution of these
21 projects for the Santa Fe Children's Museum.

22 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Jim
23 Keefner seconds that motion.

24 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: I'll take a
25 motion.

1 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Color Keefner
2 is offering to make a motion. Would you like
3 to make that motion?

4 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Jim
5 Keefner will make that motion that we accept
6 the recommendations from the Children's
7 Museum.

8 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Theresa
9 Martinez will second the motion.

10 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Very good.
11 Mr. Burney.

12 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Okay. Thank you.

13 Ms. Theresa Martinez.

14 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Aye.

15 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Carper.

16 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Aye.

17 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Keefner.

18 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Aye.

19 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Chacon.

20 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: Aye.

21 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major
22 Torres.

23 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Aye.

24 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Very good.

25 Ma'am, you have our vote, and

1 we're excited to see the outcome of these
2 projects and how it adds to and enhances the
3 Santa Fe Children's Museum. Thank you very
4 much for your presentation and your time this
5 morning.

6 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Thank you, as
7 always, for your partnership. We're very
8 appreciative, and the kids and families as
9 well.

10 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Yes, ma'am.
11 Have a great day.

12 MS. HANNAH HAUSMAN: Thank you.

13 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Okay. Moving
14 on to old business, we do have Mr. Deakin
15 here, who will talk about the ongoing process
16 of the divestment of the Deming Readiness
17 Center.

18 I'll turn the floor over to you,
19 Mr. Deakin.

20 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: Yes, sir.

21 A determination was made previously
22 that the Deming Readiness Center was excess to
23 the needs of the Guard. However, it was
24 determined to investigate to see if it was of
25 historical value and also for inclusion on

1 the Federal Register.

2 We received a memo three months ago
3 or more from the State Historical Office, and
4 it is not of historical value. The Board has
5 never officially voted to divest it, so there
6 is need for an actual vote.

7 Does anybody need any information
8 on that?

9 At present, it is leased to the
10 City of Deming, however when the lease
11 expires, it will be in a carryover status.

12 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Just real
13 quick, just to be clear, this is a property
14 that the State Armory Board owns and has
15 disposition authority over, and it's not
16 going to --

17 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: There is no
18 reversion.

19 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Reversion,
20 that's the word I was looking for. It is not
21 the city or the county, it is the State Armory
22 Board's to do what it chooses.

23 Deming was a topic about a year
24 ago, as one of the facilities that we were
25 looking at moving forward with, due to its

1 excess status and square footage status. Now
2 that the historical question has been
3 answered, I would entertain a motion, if this
4 is still needing action.

5 It's not who we're giving it to at
6 this point; we don't have that level of
7 resolution. The fact is that we do intend to
8 divest Deming Readiness Center, and we'll
9 cross the bridge later of who and how it is
10 divested.

11 I guess the initial divestment
12 consideration, I'll entertain a motion if the
13 State Armory Board is considering the
14 divestment of Deming Readiness Center.

15 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: I move to
16 authorize G-9 to divest the Deming Readiness
17 Center when it is deemed appropriate, as we
18 are the legal owners of the property.

19 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Yes. Yes. I
20 need a second.

21 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Jim
22 Keefner will second that.

23 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Thank you,
24 sir.

25 Mr. Burney.

1 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Ms. Theresa
2 Martinez.

3 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Aye.

4 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Carper.

5 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Aye.

6 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Keefner.

7 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: Aye.

8 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Colonel Chacon.

9 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: Aye.

10 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sergeant Major
11 Torres.

12 SCSM (RETIRED) JOHN TORRES: Aye.

13 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Very good.

14 Again, all that motion does is
15 give G-9 the ability at later date to divest
16 as appropriate, when the time comes, to whom
17 appropriate.

18 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: Yes, sir.

19 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Okay. Very
20 good.

21 Thank you for the old business
22 there, and we'll move on to other business.

23 We'll take a facilities management
24 update from Mr. Deakin.

25 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: Can we go back one

1 slide?

2 These are the potential divestment
3 opportunities that have been identified or
4 have already been acted on by the Board. The
5 one that are relatively new are Springer, due
6 to underutilization, which does have a
7 reversionary clause, when the land was
8 conveyed from Diamond Ranch.

9 Gallup Readiness Center, the
10 facility is still there and occupiable,
11 however, it does have issues. The land is
12 granted to the Board for specifically National
13 Guard use. This would be a divestment if
14 another parcel of land was secured and a new
15 facility was to be built.

16 This is just for information; it's
17 not for action, but consideration for future
18 actions.

19 Next please.

20 These are the facilities, the next
21 two slides are facilities and training areas,
22 and their current status, whether they are
23 owned or leased, such as Albuquerque has a
24 99-year lease that expires in 2062, which is
25 self-explanatory.

1 Happy Valley is currently leased
2 out to the City of Carlsbad as an outdoor
3 recreation area.

4 Next slide.

5 We're going to start working on
6 extending the lease at the Santa Fe AASF, to
7 do the legwork or the groundwork, so that the
8 board can take action.

9 Any questions?

10 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: I would say
11 the same for the maintenance; right?

12 MR. LORREN DEAKIN: We have been
13 working on that through the Corp of Engineers.
14 I talked to Mr. Sanchez, and Ms. LeMaster has
15 been talking to another person at Fort Bliss
16 to extend a license for the MATES facility.

17 That's all I have, sir.

18 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Any questions
19 from Board members on the current status of
20 the facilities that are occupied or in
21 control of the State Armory Board?

22 COLONEL (RETIRED) JAMES KEEFNER: No
23 questions from Jim Keefner.

24 COLONEL (RETIRED) DAVID CHACON: No
25 questions, Dave Chacon.

1 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Okay. Very
2 good.

3 Thank you Mr. Deacon for that
4 great update. I'm glad you put that together,
5 and that gives us good oversight to all the
6 facilities and their current status. We look
7 forward to the units that are on upcoming in
8 September to provide the detail on the status,
9 as we do our annual State Armory Board update
10 from the units.

11 Moving on to the next item of
12 other business, we will look at the SAB
13 balance, and the LAB balances.

14 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Good morning,
15 everybody. This is Theresa Martinez.

16 In looking at the Local Armory
17 Board checking account bank balances, I will
18 be working with the bank to access their chain
19 of command in utilizing the funds for the
20 armories. This is not going to be a State
21 Armory Board action, this is going to be
22 working through the SOP.

23 As we go through the balances, and
24 we see what units belong to what, we will be
25 working on utilizing the funds in accordance

1 with the procurement code.

2 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Yeah, and what
3 Mr. Burney is showing on the screen now is
4 the current balances. I do know that the
5 units have been proactive in the last week or
6 so to get these updated and into good status
7 moving forward, so that we have better
8 tracking.

9 Okay. For the units that are on,
10 I would stress that we get all of June's ASAP,
11 before we close out the year and before it
12 becomes an audit finding for the State, but
13 we're almost there. I know this is not
14 necessarily reflective of what it was in the
15 last couple of days, because I know some have
16 been sent in, but we need everybody to submit
17 their --

18 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: That's as of
19 this morning.

20 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: That's as of
21 this morning?

22 MS. THERESA MARTINEZ: Yes, sir.

23 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: Okay. All
24 right. I stand corrected. We'll get this
25 addressed.

1 For the units that are on, if
2 you're delinquent, please address this ASAP.
3 We need to close out June before we get an
4 audit finding.

5 Somebody has a hot mic out there.

6 Okay. If there's any questions or
7 discussion on the SAB balances or LAB
8 balances, I open it up for a second for those
9 in the room.

10 Okay. Nothing heard.

11 So we'll move on to announcements.

12 Again from the General's
13 standpoint, the State Armory Board, we will
14 continue to hold as directed by statute. We
15 do want to get more focused in on items that
16 need to be voted on, and items that can have
17 action.

18 Anything that falls outside of
19 that, we will take care of in a different
20 forum, to prepare that, so that we can be
21 respectful of everybody's time that calls
22 into the meeting and takes time out of your
23 personal time to be a part of this. We're
24 trying to streamline this a little bit faster,
25 and have actionable items for the State

1 Armory Board when you call the meeting. I
2 would think we want to stress that.

3 The second thing is the continued
4 support from the New Mexico National Guard in
5 its entirety, to the citizens of New Mexico
6 on a daily basis, the state. The Department
7 of Military Affairs continues to support our
8 communities during these trying times with
9 the fires, the potential flooding, and the
10 ongoing COVID response.

11 For the edification of the Board
12 members, you can be proud of what we're doing
13 to continue to help our citizens.

14 Anything else this morning?

15 Mr. Burney, if you would,
16 please --

17 MR. MARTY BURNEY: Sir.

18 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: -- state the
19 date of the next meeting.

20 MR. MARTY BURNEY: The next meeting is
21 September 15th at 10:00 o'clock.

22 COLONEL NATHAN CARPER: That is

1 that has been sent out. That will be a little
2 bit longer, likely, and we encourage everybody

4 good time.
